## Notice of Random Seed for the Risk-limiting Post-election Audit of Colorado's 2020 Presidential Primary Election

DENVER, March 13, 2020 – Colorado Secretary of State Jena Griswold convened a public meeting today at 9:00 am in the Blue Spruce conference room on the second floor of her offices at 1700 Broadway, Denver, Colorado, to establish the random seed for the 2020 Presidential Primary Election risk-limiting audit (RLA). The Secretary of State published public notice of the meeting on March 5, 2020, as required by Election Rule 25.2.2(i).

The random seed is a number consisting of at least 20 digits, with each digit selected in order by sequential rolls of 20 individual 10-sided dice. The Secretary of State randomly selected members of the public who attended the public meeting to take turns rolling the dice to define the seed.

The Secretary of State will publish on the Audit Center of her official website (<u>http://www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/auditCenter.html</u>) this record of the random seed immediately after it is established, as required by Election Rule 25.2.2 (i). In addition, during the process of defining and starting the risk-limiting audit, Elections Division staff members will enter the random seed into the pseudo-random number generator of the Secretary of State's RLA software. Establishing the seed in this manner results in a truly random, but repeatable, selection

of individual ballots for each participating county to examine and audit, and ensures the integrity and statistical validity of the risk-limiting audit.

The audit was conducted under software Version 2.3.10 of the Colorado RLA software.
